Mission

The College of Education is committed to advancing the quality of education and wellness by preparing professional practitioners and leaders for improving education and healthcare promotion in all settings and by advancing research and scholarship. The College of Education recognizes that improving education and wellness can lead to economic development and to the improvement of quality of life nationally as well as for the citizens of Louisiana.

1. Major accomplishments related to the Flagship Agenda
 - **Recruited and hired outstanding new faculty** –
 - For the AY 09, eight faculty were hired with terminal degrees from Texas A&M, University of Virginia, University of Alabama, University of Georgia, Penn State, University of Kansas, and University of Nijmegen (Netherlands).
 - Over the past four years, successful recruiting strategies have resulted in a transformation in the composition of the tenure/tenure track ranks (**28% non-tenured in AY 2004 to 47% non-tenured in AY 09**).
 - **Progress on Forever LSU Campaign** – at 88% of our Campaign goal with 18 months to go in the campaign.
 - **Significantly increased** research and outreach productivity through sponsored programs.
 - 5-Year Trend
 - Proposal Submissions **up 121%**
 - New Submissions requests up: \$14.0 M in FY 05; **\$31.1M in FY 08**
 - Annual New Awards **up 75%**;
 - Annual sponsored activity up \$2.8M in FY 05; **\$4.8M in FY 08**
 - So far during Fiscal Year 2009
 - Annual New Awards as of 3/31/09 are already **67% over** our FY 2008
 - With approximately **\$8.0 M** new awards so far this year, the College of Education is **currently 3rd among academic units** (BS \$18.1M, ENG \$12.6M, COE \$8.0M, SCE \$7.8M, VetMed \$5.9M)
 - **Increased faculty participation in funded projects from 17 or 29% in 2005-06 to 43 or 72% in FY 09.**
 - **Additional Resources brought to the University** through Indirect Cost Recovery through sponsored programs (15% of all IDC funds generated by the College).
 - 5-Year Trend in College IDC Recovery is up **177%**;
 - **Increased from \$19,000 in FY 05 to \$52,600 FY 08;**
 - In this last fiscal year alone, IDC recovery increased by **over 81%**.

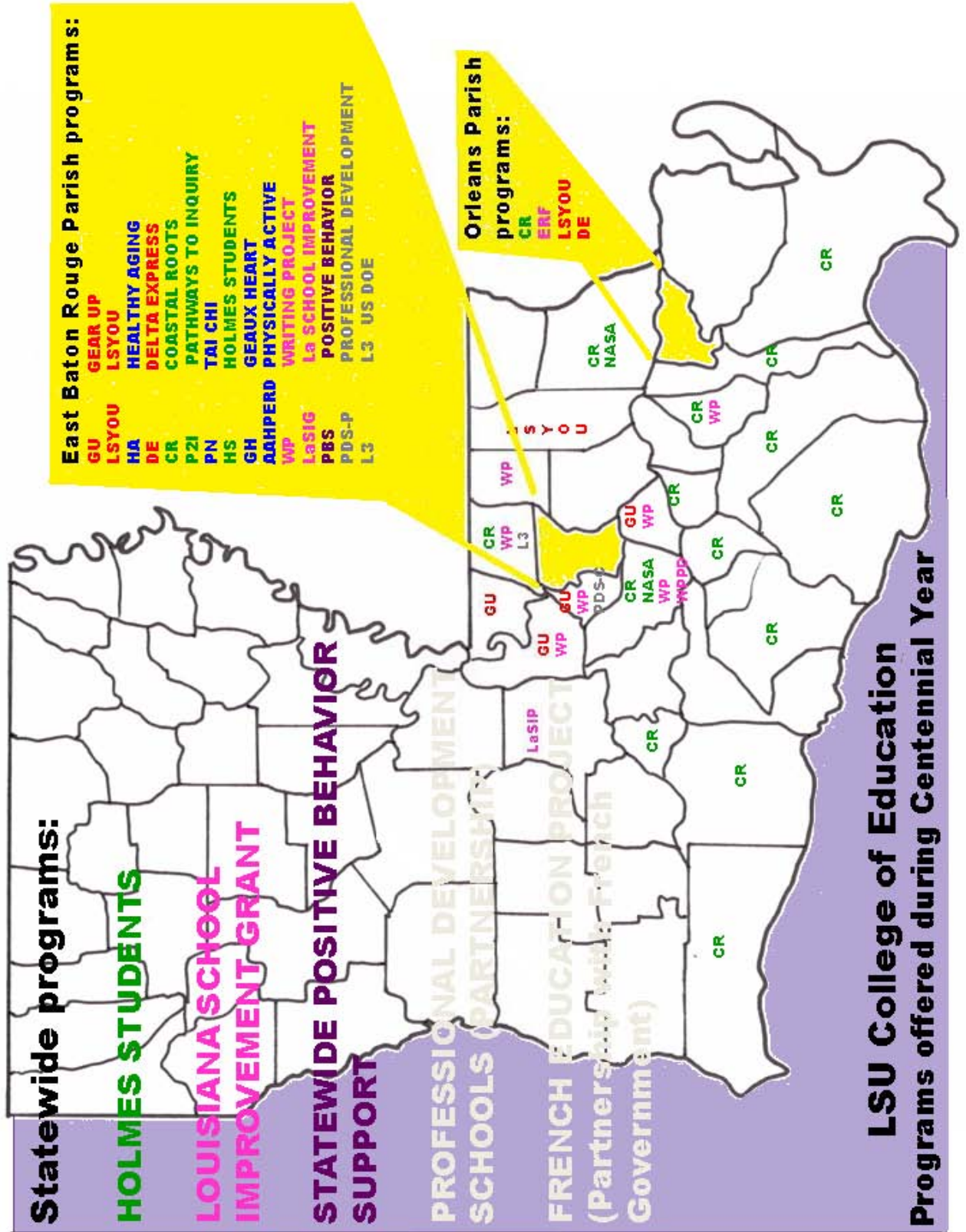
- **Endowment Increased 71%** from **\$1.7M to \$2.9M** over the past five years; in FY 08 alone raised a total of **\$2.8M in new endowed & non-endowed** gifts
 - **Support to Students** through academic scholarships (5-year trend from AY 05 to AY 09)
 - Graduate: Number of awards increased from **26 to 55 (111.5%)** and the total amount of awards increased from **\$44,200 to \$95,145 (115.2%)**
 - Undergraduate: Number of awards increased from 16 to 18 (12.5%) and the total amount of awards increased from \$11,665 to \$17,120 (46.8%)
2. Accomplishments in the areas of engagement and mobilizing constituencies
- **Outreach to every parish in the state** (see map on the last page of this report).
 - **Alumni Reunions** this past year for COE graduates- Houston, Atlanta, Austin, Shreveport and Baton Rouge.
 - **New Orleans Presence** –
 - \$3.6 M Early Reading First grant
 - \$110,000 from JOB1, the City of New Orleans workforce development office and a four-year \$376,000 commitment from the AT&T Foundation as part of America’s Promise to expand our LSYOU operations into the New Orleans area.

3. Collaborative Relationships
- **Teacher Education and Educational Leadership Initiatives** with Board of Regents, State Department of Education and the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education
 - **Outreach to children, families and community** through partnerships with local non-profits including Academic Distinction Fund, Advance Baton Rouge, Baton Rouge Area Chamber, Baton Rouge Area Foundation, BREC, Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, Greater Baton Rouge Literacy Coalition, YWCA Center for Family Empowerment, Big Buddy Program, and Volunteers in Public Schools.
 - **School Partnerships** through field placements including a network of over 40 schools in eight different school districts
 - **Professional Development School Partnerships** expanding through funded projects and leadership development initiatives
 - **Direct Support to Schools** including over \$800,000 in services to over 1,000 East Baton Rouge Parish Schools students and \$150,000 in services to over 200 students in the City of Baker schools through a \$5.4M 6-year GEAR UP grant
 - **Collaborative Relationships Across Campus** with the colleges of A&S, Basic Sciences, Music and Dramatic Arts, and Agriculture (SHREWD and HUEC), and

the School of Library and Information Sciences for accreditation of our teacher preparation and advanced certification programs and for various accountability mandates
