Farewell to Dr. Lee

Dr. Amelia Lee joined the College of Education in 1971. She has focused her research primarily on the role that self-perceptions of ability play in achievement behavior. She has explored how beliefs, expectations, motivations and attitudes served as mediators between teaching and learning. Other interests include the study of gender differences in achievement-related cognition, affect and behavior. Dr. Lee has coauthored two books on physical education for children. She was President of the Research Consortium for the 1998 American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance (AAHPERD) and has served as editor of *Quest*, and a member of the editorial boards of *Journal of Teaching in Physical Education and Research Quarterly for Exercise and Sport*. She is a fellow in the American Academy of Kinesiology and Physical Education. In addition, Dr. Lee received the 2004 American Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance (AAHPERD) Alliance Scholar Award.
